The Chants of the Assembly Fifth Sunday of Lent, Year C: Solidarity Sunday

During the season of Lent, save Laetare Sunday and several feast days, instruments are only used to accompany singing. Therefore, the organ does not play solo.

Entrance

[At eleven o'clock only: a cantor briefly intones the singing, after which the Assembly sings in the usual manner.

Cantor:

"... We are all God's blessed children; in the spirit we are one."]

Assembly:

Come and Journey with a Saviour
who has called us from our birth,
who has washed us in the waters,
and who loved us on the earth.
Come and journey, journey inward,
come and seek him deep within,
where he meets us in our living,
in our striving and our sin.

2. Come and journey, journey outward,
telling others of his name,
telling others of his glory,
of his cross and of the shame.
Come and journey, journey outward,
where that cross calls us to care,
where injustice and where hunger
and the poor call us to share.

3. Come and journey, journey upward.
Sing his praises, offer prayer.
In the storm and in the stillness
find his presence everywhere.
Come and journey, journey onward;
all our gifts we now shall bring
to the building of a city
that is holy, Christ its King.

Assembly: *R. Whatsoever You Do* to the least of my people, that you do unto me.

The cantor intones the Refrain, after which a repetition and all subsequent Refrains are sung by the Assembly.

After the Dismissal

Unless remaining for private prayer, the Assembly, having heard the Dismissal (or 'Ite Missa Est') departs the church in procession flowing out into the main aisle behind the priest as he passes by. To go forth in this manner, having been spiritually nourished through the Eucharist, is a powerful sign of acceptance of the mission to live according to the Gospel, being a bright light to the world, and telling the good news of Jesus Christ throughout the world.



Today's Gospel shares the parable of the woman accused of adultery. Jesus admonishes the gathered scribes and Pharisees. They want her stoned and Jesus says "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her."

Our Lord's message is one of great love, forgiveness and respect for all of God's people.
