Orientation Meeting Sunday Oct 30, 2pm

St. Patrick's Out of the Cold program seeks to respond to the immediate need for food for our vulnerable population each weekend from November to April. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and lack of funding from the City of Toronto, St. Patrick's Out of the Cold will not be serving dinner or providing accommodations to our guests for the 2022/2023 season. However, to help as many homeless guests and people facing food insecurity as possible, we will be preparing meals at St. Patrick's which will then be served by two agencies at their locations by local staff: Good Shepherd Ministries on Queen Street, and St. Felix on Augusta Avenue.
