Horizons of Hope Program

Horizons of Hope is a program developed by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops to help us make informed decisions about end-of-life issues. In response to the increasing promotion of Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) and recent efforts to broaden its eligibility, the Archdiocese has requested all parishes to implement this program. As Catholics, it is vital for us to understand the Gospel of Life and the Church's teachings on this important topic, so we can better support our loved ones and those in our faith community. The program is free and includes 4 workshops, each 2 hours long. Each workshop will take place in the church on each Sunday in November, shortly following the 11am Mass. Refreshments will be served.

To register, a Parish Pastoral Council member will be available for in-person sign-ups after each of the Masses on October

19th/20th and October 26th/27th. Please take the time to consider participating in this program.

Altar Servers Needed

We need new Altar Servers to serve at all weekend masses. Anyone over the age of seven who has made their First Communion are welcome. Please see Fr. Tom after any mass.

Side Ramp and Accessible Entrance to the Church

As the construction on the building next door proceeds, very soon they are going to need to temporarily close off the side entrance to the church in order to remove the protective scaffolding and to complete concrete and drainage work, and to construct an integrated passage between the two buildings. This will likely take two to three months to complete.

In order to provide accessible access to the church during this time for those with wheelchairs, walkers and strollers, a temporary ramp will be installed through the double set of doors leading down into the parish hall at 139 McCaul Street.

Those with accessibility requirements will need to enter and exit through the parish hall in order to use the elevator/lift to get in and out of the church. There will be volunteers to assist during the weekday and weekend Masses.

If you have any questions or concerns please speak with Father Tom or contact the parish office.

Volunteers Needed for Accessibility Entrance

In order for this to help people access the church through the parish hall, we need 2 new volunteers at each mass on Sundays and Wednesdays who will be "physically able" to assist on a regular basis. As we cannot leave the entrance through the hall unattended, this will involve being able to come and assist one hour before each mass to help people needing access, and then to stay after mass to help people exit. Please speak to Fr. Tom after any mass or contact the parish office.

Good Shepherd Thanksgiving Food Drive
