**Horizons of Hope Program**

**Do you want to know more about palliative care?**

The Parish Pastoral Council at St. Patrick's Church invites you to participate in learning sessions on Horizons of Hope: A Toolkit for Catholic Parishes on Palliative Care. Our faith in Jesus Christ has much to teach us about living well until the end of life. The program will help parishioners, caregivers, and family members facing a terminal illness to learn more about palliative care. Throughout four modules, the learning and discussion sessions address themes such as understanding the dying process, discernment and decision-making at the end of life, accompaniment and the importance of building compassionate communities.

The four-module program will take place in the church.

- Module 1: November 3rd from 1:00pm to 3:00pm
- Module 2: November 10th from 1:00pm to 3:00pm
- Module 3: November 17th from 1:00pm to 3:00pm
- Module 4: November 24th from 1:00pm to 3:00pm

**Liturgy of the Word for Children**

The Liturgy of the Word for Children takes place on Sundays at the 11 o'clock Mass. This ministry is intended for children between the ages 3-7. After the opening prayer, children who wish to attend are invited to come forward for a blessing before proceeding to the church hall to hear the Gospel in simple relatable language. Our trained leaders help the children to understand the readings through prayers, discussions and activities. The children return for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Parents are always welcome to accompany their children, especially the very young.

**Leaders Needed!** New Adult Group Leaders\* are needed for this ministry. High school students are also welcome to serve as Leader Assistants and can fulfill high school service hours. ## Out of the Cold Program

This year's Out of the Cold Program begins on the weekend of November 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>. For 20 weeks, our volunteers will be preparing meals each week for 600 people in need. Once again we are partnering with two agencies (Good Shepherd Ministries on Queen Street East & the St. Felix Centre on Fraser Avenue) who will serve the meals at their locations, by local staff. The Out of the Cold Program is run by committed volunteers and relies on donations from individuals and businesses. This year, local experts say one in 10 Toronto residents now rely on food banks to get through the month.

There are 3 convenient ways to make a financial contribution:

1. There are Out of the Cold Envelopes available in the church. Cash or cheques can be placed in the Offertory collection at Mass at any time. Please make cheques out to "St. Patrick's Church" and on the memo line write "Out of the Cold".

Choose "Parish Offertory" and follow the steps. It is important to indicate "Out of the Cold" in the "notes or directives" section.
