After 4 years of absence from visiting Ashadeep, Barbara Galbraith spent August and September at the Centre for the Differently Abled in the diocese of Bijnor, North India. She will be giving an update and powerpoint presentation on her visit there and the developments that have taken place since the last visit in 2020. The Centre and St. Joseph's school have grown and a variety of projects have been accomplished. The funds collected at St. Patrick's over the last four years have been used to build a school library and purchase books, to purchase a desperately needed bus, and many supplies for the classrooms. These projects will be shown in the ppt. as well as photos of the children and the school.

This will take place on **December 1<sup>st</sup>** during the coffee hour after the 11:00 am Mass and after the 5:00pm Sunday Mass at the back of the church. Also, during the Open-Door lunch on **Wednesday December 4<sup>th</sup>**.

## Out of the Cold Program

This year's Out of the Cold Program begins on the weekend of November 16<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>. For 20 weeks, our volunteers will be preparing meals each week for 600 people in need. Once again we are partnering with two agencies (Good Shepherd Ministries on Queen Street East & the St. Felix Centre on Fraser Avenue) who will serve the meals at their locations, by local staff. The Out of the Cold Program is run by committed volunteers and relies on donations from individuals and businesses. This year, local experts say one in 10 Toronto residents now rely on food banks to get through the month.

There are 3 convenient ways to make a financial contribution:

1. There are Out of the Cold Envelopes available in the church. Cash or cheques can be placed in the Offertory collection at Mass at any time. Please make cheques out to "St. Patrick's Church" and on the memo line write "Out of the Cold".
