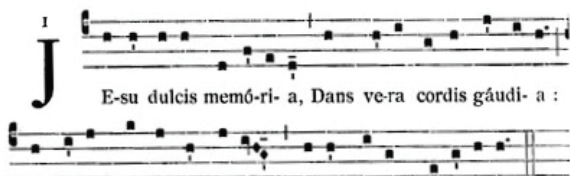

Good Shepherd Thanksgiving Food Drive

Good Shepherd Ministries has begun their Thanksgiving Food
Drive in order to help provide meals for homeless and at-risk
individuals. Each day they serve upward of 950 meals each day.

Tuna and canned meat; coffee & tea bags; soup & stews; condiments (e.g. soy sauce, barbecue sauce, ketchup, mayonnaise, mustard); jams; beans & chickpeas; canned tomatoes, corn & vegetables; pasta sauce; sugar, salt, pepper, and spices; salad dressings; cooking oil; pancake mix; bagged rice; mini-sized juice boxes; granola bars & packaged snacks.
