Remembering the Faithful Departed in the Month of November

All Souls' Day Masses – Sunday, November 2nd

Sunday, November 2nd is the “Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed”, or “All Soul’s Day”. Since it falls on a Sunday this year, the faithful departed will be remembered at all of the Sunday Masses (which includes the Saturday Vigil Mass). However, there will be a special remembrance of the dead at the 11:00am Mass on Sunday.

The Book of the Names of the Dead is available for those who wish to write the names of deceased loved ones. On All Souls’ Day and at Sunday Masses of November, they will be included in the prayers of our parish community throughout the month.

All Souls’ Day Offering Envelopes

Envelopes are available in the church for those who wish to make an offering for the Masses that will be celebrated for the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (**All Souls’ Day**), on Sunday, **November 2nd**. They may be placed in the collection basket during the Offertory or deposited in one of the four prayer intention boxes located along the back counters, on or before November 2nd.
