As the final phase of the organ's refurbishment – the modernization of the pistons* – is completed, our 1946 Casavant Pipe Organ will be temporarily out of service this weekend. Accordingly, the Choir will sing the proper chants from the Graduale Romanum (Roman Gradual) at the Entrance and Communion – the first option in the Roman Rite – sung a cappella as intended. The hymns we normally sing replace these prescribed chants. The faithful are invited to participate in these chants by attentive listening, by contemplating the ministers' approach to the altar in procession, and by joining their hearts to the sung prayer. Thank you for your understanding as we complete this important work. We look forward to the organs renewed service to our worship the weeks and indeed year ahead.

As the ministers withdraw, In Paradisum (Gather 977) is sung by all. The translation appears under the Latin text.

*A note on organ pistons

In a pipe organ, whereas "stops" are the knobs or tabs that turn groups of pipes on and off, creating different tone colors and volumes, "Pistons" are small buttons located beneath the keyboards and toe studs near the pedals that act like memory presets: with one touch, the organist can instantly recall a chosen combination of stops. This allows smooth, quick changes in sound. The current work modernizes the organ's mechanical action the system that controls these pistons. The upgrade improves reliability, adds more memory levels, and enables seamless transitions during the liturgy once the organ returns to service. Thank you for your flexibility as we complete this important enhancement.
