Out of the Cold Program 2025-2026

Our parish's Out of the Cold Program begins last weekend. For 20 weeks, our dedicated volunteers will prepare meals for over 600 people in need each week, partnering once again with Good Shepherd Ministries (Queen Street East) and the St. Felix Centre (Augusta Avenue), where the meals will be served.

The cost of purchasing food for this program continues to rise sharply. Last year, food expenses for the 20-week program totaled nearly \$40,000, reflecting not only the scale of this outreach but also the growing challenge of feeding so many in need. At the same time, one in ten Torontonians now rely on food banks to make it through the month. Your generosity is essential in helping us continue this vital ministry and ensure that every person receives a warm, nourishing meal.

Humanitarian Relief Fund

In recent days, two natural disasters have caused extensive damage in different parts of the world. On Tuesday, October 28, **Hurricane Melissa** made landfall in Jamaica as a Category 5 storm, causing severe damage to both Jamaica and Haiti. It was the third strongest hurricane ever recorded in the Atlantic Ocean. Melissa collapsed roads, flooded bridges, destroyed buildings, and wiped out fishing areas and crops across the islands. Hundreds of thousands are still without power and telecommunications remain unstable. A lack of fuel and food has magnified the crisis with many homes destroyed and thousands displaced.

Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. declared a state of emergency on Thursday, November 6 in the aftermath of **Typhoon Kalmaegi**, which left more than 100 people dead and hundreds still unaccounted for. It is estimated that more than 500,000 people have been displaced due to the severity of the storm. Floods, landslides and falling debris continue to be severe hazards for local residents. Significant damage is also anticipated as the storm moves across Vietnam and Thailand.

The Archdiocese of Toronto will accept donations and channel funds through our Catholic partners in the Caribbean & Asia to support relief efforts underway in both regions. Those wishing to help may do so in the following ways:

Ashadeep Advent Giving Tree

Again, as in past years during Advent, we focus our thoughts and giving on the children of Ashadeep Centre for the Differently Abled in North India. This year again, we will have the Ashadeep Giving Tree during the four Sundays of Advent.

Last year your generous donations along with other donors, raised \$25,000 to provide equipment for physiotherapy, occupational therapy and a sensory room for the physically and mentally challenged children. This year the need is for a Braille lab and a Sensory Garden. As Fr. Baiju the priest who is developing facilities for the disabled children tells us:

Establishing a Braille Lab for visually impaired children is a commendable initiative that can significantly enhance their literacy and independence. Sensory gardens engage all five senses – sight, sound, touch, smell, and taste – providing a rich environment for children to explore and interact with.

During Advent there will be a photo display at the back of the church showing the newly equipped physiotherapy and sensory rooms at Ashadeep, which you funded and also photos and videos on the parish website.

The tree is set up at the back of the church for all of Advent. As usual, it will be decorated with small gifts. Instead of buying a gift for someone (who may not need it!) you can donate in their name and take an ornament to give as representative of the gift. All money goes directly to support the children of Ashadeep.

There will be envelopes in which you can place your donation, cheque or cash, and these can be placed in the boxes at the back of the church or in the collection during Mass.

THANK YOU for your ongoing generosity in supporting Ashadeep for the last 17 years. The children and priests at Ashadeep are grateful for your support and keep the parishioners of St. Patrick's continually in their prayers.
